show them our flat, neighborhood, and Budapest! Although it was hard to see them go at the end of the week, it truly was a refreshing and encouraging visit. Thank you so much for praying for their travel!





As I shared on Facebook, this month we received Brooke & Judah's newly approved Residence Permits! And, best of all, they were approved for 2 years instead of just one! Thank you so much for praying! I ask that you continue to pray, as it seems that my card has been lost in the mail. It has been 3 weeks since we received Brooke and Judah's. After contacting the the Immigration Office, it seems that the letter which was never delivered has been sent back to them. I'm hoping to be able to go pick it up next week. Although not having it could potentially be a problem, it is good to know that since the card does exist, I am in fact legally residing here in Hungary, haha. Please pray that I can get it soon!

Unfortunately, Covid restrictions continue to increase here in Hungary. Now, it is once again mandatory to wear masks everywhere that is indoors, as well as on all public transportation. I'll spare you the specifics, but the government has been heavily pushing certain "things" that they deem the best response to the pandemic. The increasing restrictions can make life and ministry more difficult.

Please pray that they don't continue to increase, and that we won't have anymore mass lockdowns again this winter.

With that being said, I am excited to tell you about our big Christmas outreach ministry! Wyldewood Baptist Church (Lambertville, MI) is continuing their annual ministry of buying Christmas gifts and giving them to several Hungarian schools and orphanages. December 6 is Mikulás napja (Santa Claus Day) in Hungary, and that is the week that the gifts are given. Several hundred gifts will be given in 4 different cities this year! One school is in Budapest, and the other three are several hours away. At each school I will be delivering the gifts, and presenting the gospel at an event that each school organizes.

*Now, due to increasing Covid restrictions (especially within schools), we have already had to shuffle our plans. I will be getting PCR tests done in order to visit the schools. The current dates that I will be in the schools are November 30th, December 6th, and December 7th. Satan would love to stop the gospel being presented to over 500 people, so please pray for:

- Negative PCR tests, and an easy time getting into each of these schools
- The gospel to be presented clearly (through translation) and kids would hear and consider!
- Seeds of the gospel to be planted, and people to be saved!
- NO further covid restrictions that would hinder our plans, or make things more difficult





Thank you all so much for your prayers! On December 10th, we will have been in Hungary for 1 year! It is amazing how fast the time goes. Last year, when we arrived, we didn't get to enjoy any of the Christmas markets or festivities that Hungary usually has to offer, because they were all cancelled. We are excited to go visit them this year, and enjoy our 2nd official (but 1st true) Christmas in Budapest. Also, please continue to pray for us for language learning, and "seeking men". We continue to build relationships with friends in hopes to study the Bible and share the gospel. Please pray that God would lead us to those who are seeking truth, and provide good soil for planting seeds of the gospel.
